4.1 Have any additional potential equality issues been raised during the consultation, and, if so, how has the Committee addressed them?

The committee noted that geographical isolation for example those living in rural areas, may be a barrier to receiving fertility treatment as people may not be able or willing to travel long distances for fertility clinics on a regular basis.

The committee felt that provision of fertility treatment to same-sex couples was adequately covered in recommendation 1.9.1.1. This recommendation covers that unstimulated IUI may be considered in the following groups as an alternative to vaginal sexual intercourse: people who are unable to, or would find it very difficult to, have vaginal intercourse, people with conditions that require specific consideration in relation to methods of conception and people in same-sex relationships.

The committee agreed to amend the sentence: 'The committee noted access to fertility services by people may be limited and may vary by geographical location' to 'The committee noted access to fertility services by people can be limited and can vary by geographical location'.
