

# IPG398 - Endoscopic radical inguinal lymphadenectomy

Endoscopic radical excision of inguinal lymph nodes (839091000000107)

T85.5 Block dissection of inguinal lymph nodes

or

- T87.7 Excision or biopsy of inguinal lymph node
- Y76.3 Endoscopic approach to other body cavity

or

Y76.5 Robotic assisted minimal access approach to other body cavity

If resection of the saphenous vein is required the following codes are included:

#### L93.1 Excision of vein NEC

or

Y76.5 Robotic assisted minimal access approach to other body cavity

A site code is also selected:

Z98.5 Long saphenous vein

**Z98.6 Short saphenous vein** 

**Z39.5 Saphenous vein NEC** 

**Note:** A laterality code is also added: either **Z94.1 Bilateral operation** or **Z94.2 Right sided operation** or **Z94.3 Left sided operation**
