		The GDG was then asked to declare any new or updated conflicts of interests:	
		KL has been granted rapid response money from the Department of Health to conduct a participatory project with care leavers with long-term conditions, to explore their experiences and understandings of their transition into adulthood.	
2.	Minutes and matters arising	The GDG Chair accepted the minutes as an accurate record of the meeting.	
3.	Revisiting the evidence on Effectiveness of support	KL reminded the GDG of the review questions and gave a brief overview of which review question will be presented at each meeting.	

	models, frameworks and interventions to improve transition from children's to adult services (Q 4.5.5 & 4.5.6)	At the last meeting the GDG agreed that the evidence for questions 4.5.5 and 4.5.6 should be revisited with the search criteria broadened to include research post 2006. KL presented the number of studies found post 2006. KL then presented 3 evidence statements from the presented evidence for the GDG to consider. KL also informed the GDG of the forthcoming Cochrane review on 'Interventions to improve transition of care for adolescents from paediatrics services to adult services' which will be highly significant to this guideline. HG informed the GDG that Fiona Campbell will also be presenting at a conference on Transition in London in the next week or so and will forward details of the event to members.	
4.	Economic evidence	 MT highlighted the main areas of the economic evaluation and highlighted the tasks that the GDG needed to consider for the economic modelling work: Prioritise areas Feasibility of cost intervention Equity impact MT presented economic evidence reviews from 2 studies and provided some suggestions for the economic modelling. The GDG agreed that economic evaluations should be carried out on the studies that were presented by MT, however the GDG needed to decide which studies should be prioritised. It was therefore agreed that MT will email the GDG a summary and rationale of the work that will be carried out.	Action 1: MT to email GDG a summary and rationale of the work that will be carried out.
5.	Review of the evidence on: What transition training is available for health and social care professionals in children's and adult services? What is the effectiveness of transition training? (Q4.5.9)	IQ presented the evidence on training and concluded that there were no studies that met the inclusion criteria. The options for addressing this would therefore be to invite an expert witness to provide a testimony or to use the expertise of the GDG to make consensus recommendations.
