10.00	<p>Introduction, welcome and meeting objectives</p> <p>The chair :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduced the GDG to the 12th GDG meeting • Gave an overview of agenda for the day • Ran through the minutes from the last meeting with the GDG. GDG considered the minutes a truthful account of the first meeting <p>No new DOIs were noted</p>
10.10	<p>Main comments from Stakeholders</p> <p>Dr Norma O'Flynn presented the main themes in terms of the comments received during the stakeholder consultation. These were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Stakeholders (SH) were generally happy that the guideline did not have age 7 years as lower limit ■ No major issues regarding interpretation of evidence ■ Issues regarding size of full guideline ■ Intake figures, the evidence we are using and if we want to give advice regarding teenagers ■ Desmopressin- few issues: is follow up clear, timing of taking desmopressin, need to clarify that can take long term, and if we want to add 'as first line treatment' ■ Not clear regarding those who have non-response ■ Need to define specialists ■ Sickle cell and day time symptoms- SH seem to not understand that recommendations are permissive rather than saying this is what these patients should have ■ Need more clarity about when to use tricyclic and anticholinergics ■ Add 'full physical exam' for anti-cholinergic ■ Algorithms confusing <p>The chair led the GDG through the revisions the project team had conducted on the recommendations in light of the SH comments. The main aim was to agree those revisions and wording of recommendations</p>
