Alice Navein, Systematic Reviewer, presented evidence review question 2.1: 'What are the barriers and facilitators to identifying people with rehabilitation needs due to chronic neurological disorders and enabling access to appropriate services, including re-referral?'

The committee discussed the approach to writing these recommendations. They agreed upon recommendations to be made and the impact of decisions by theme.

The committee continued to discuss and write recommendations for evidence review question 2.1: 'What are the barriers and facilitators to identifying people with rehabilitation needs due to chronic neurological disorders and enabling access to appropriate services, including rereferral?'
