No. It is worth highlighting that ProKnow DS currently supports exporting structures that are closed and located on a single plane. The EAG noted that non-axial computed tomography (CT) slices are used with brachytherapy, a procedure more commonly used with gynaecological cancers. The Company confirmed an intention for ProKnow to support non-axial structures, however, they do not have an anticipated timescale for this enhancement.
