1. Welcome, apologies and objectives for the meeting

2. Confirmation of matter under discussion, and declarations of interest	
<p>The Chair confirmed that for the purpose of managing conflicts of interest, the matter under discussion was Alcohol: school-based interventions.</p> <p>The Chair asked everyone to verbally declare any interests that have arisen since the last meeting, or were not included in the distributed DOI registry.</p> <p>None were declared.</p>	
3. Equality Impact Assessment	
<p>The Chair introduced Sarah Boyce, Technical Analyst at NICE who led the discussion on the Equality Impact Assessment in relation to the Committee's work.</p>	
4. Resource Impact	
<p>The Chair introduced Hugh McGuire, Technical Adviser at NICE who provided an introduction to the resource impact team and their role in guideline development. This included how resource impact follows on from economic analysis and what is considered to have 'substantial' impact.</p>

The Committee were give the opportunity to ask questions and discuss in relation to developing recommendations.

5. Health Economics modelling update

The Chair introduced Hayden Holmes, Health Economist at York Health Economics Consortium who presented an update on the economic evidence using sensitivity analysis.

The Committee were given the opportunity to ask questions and discuss what evidence had been presented – this included the economic model, included interventions, key outputs and results.

The Chair thanked Hayden for his contribution to the meeting.

6. Review of recommendations: universal interventions

Sarah Boyd, Technical Analyst provided a summary of evidence for the universal school-based interventions and led the discussion on what conclusions, if any, could be drawn from this.

The Committee considered the evidence and drafted appropriate recommendations.

7. Expert Testimony

The Chair introduced Professor Chris Hatton, from Lancaster University who provided expert testimony (via Skype) to cover the gap in evidence for age of first drink and age at first experience of drunkenness in the SEND population.

Chris presented self-reported alcohol use among adolescents and young adults with mild to moderate intellectual disability. This included alcohol usage and attitudes to alcohol at age 11, factors associated with alcohol use in young people and PHE Reasonable Adjustments Guidance on substance misuse and people with learning disabilities.

The Committee had the opportunity to ask any questions and discuss the evidence presented to them.

The Chair thanked Chris for his contribution to the meeting.

8. Review of recommendations: targeted interventions

Sarah Boyd, Technical Analyst summarised the evidence for the targeted school-based interventions and led the discussion on what recommendations, if any, could be made from this.

The Committee considered whether targeted interventions work, how they should be
