<b>Review questions by scope area</b>	1. Which interventions are most effective and cost effective in preventing drug misuse among groups of people most at risk?
Population	<p>Groups at increased risk of drug misuse:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• people who have mental health problems</li> <li>• people involved in commercial sex work or who are being sexually exploited</li> <li>• people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender</li> <li>• people not in employment, education or training (including children and young people who are excluded from school or are regular truants)</li> <li>• children and young people whose parents use drugs</li> <li>• looked after children and young people</li> <li>• children and young people who are in contact with young offender teams but not in secure environments (prisons and young offender institutions)</li> <li>• people who are considered homeless</li> <li>• people who attend nightclubs and festivals</li> <li>• people who are known to misuse drugs occasionally / recreationally.</li> </ul>
Interventions and comparators considered for inclusion	<p>7 x CUA covering 7 interventions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 x family based interventions</li> <li>• 1 x web-based feedback</li> <li>• 2 x motivational interviewing</li> <li>• 1 x brief motivational interviewing</li> </ul> <p>Comparator 'usual care'</p>
