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Advice

NICE is unable to make a recommendation about the use in the NHS of pembrolizumab for treating recurrent or metastatic squamous cell carcinoma of the head and neck after platinum-based chemotherapy because Merck Sharp & Dohme UK Ltd did not provide an evidence submission. The company has confirmed that it does not intend to make a submission for the appraisal because the technology is unlikely to be used at this point in the treatment pathway.
