

Daratumumab in combination for untreated multiple myeloma when a stem cell transplant is suitable

Information for the public

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Daratumumab (Darzalex) plus bortezomib, thalidomide and dexamethasone is available on the NHS as a possible induction and consolidation treatment for untreated multiple myeloma in adults, when an autologous stem cell transplant is suitable.

Is this treatment right for me?
