



Pembrolizumab for adjuvant treatment of renal cell carcinoma

Pembrolizumab (Keytruda) is available on the NHS. It is a possible adjuvant treatment (used after surgery to reduce the chance of the cancer coming back) for renal cell carcinoma at increased risk of recurrence after nephrectomy, with or without metastatic lesion resection, in adults.

Is this treatment right for me?

Your healthcare professionals should give you clear information, talk with you about your options and listen carefully to your views and concerns. Your family can be involved too, if you wish. Read more about <u>making decisions about your care</u>.

Questions to think about

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- · What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
- How will the treatment affect my day-to-day life?
- What happens if the treatment does not work?
- What happens if I do not want to have treatment? Are there other treatments available?
