



Maribavir for treating refractory or resistant cytomegalovirus infection after transplant

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Maribavir (Livtencity) is available on the NHS. It is a possible treatment for cytomegalovirus infection in adults who have had a stem cell transplant or organ transplant. It is only recommended if the infection comes back after, or does not respond well enough to, treatments such as ganciclovir, valganciclovir, cidofovir or foscarnet.

Is this treatment right for me?

Your healthcare professionals should give you clear information, talk with you about your options and listen carefully to your views and concerns. Your family can be involved too, if you wish. Read more about <u>making decisions about your care</u>.

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- · What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
