

Voclosporin with mycophenolate mofetil for treating lupus nephritis

Information for the public

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Voclosporin (Lupkynis) with mycophenolate mofetil is available on the NHS as a possible treatment for treating active class 3 to 5 (including mixed class 3 and 5, and 4 and 5) lupus nephritis in adults.

Is this treatment right for me?

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
- What are the risks or side effects? How likely are they?
