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Ivosidenib (Tibsovo) with azacitidine is available on the NHS. It is a possible treatment for untreated acute myeloid leukaemia with an IDH1 R132 mutation in adults who cannot have standard intensive induction chemotherapy.

Is this treatment right for me?

- How well does it work compared with other treatments?
